From 12 h to 8 h Nov. 14

1. Hostile situation at the beginning of the day - unchanged
2. Information received of enemy during the day - probable retirement from our front on Nov. 14.
3. Hostile movements, changes and action and conduct during the day - N.T.R.
4. Map illustrating the above - N.T.R.
5. Own situation at the beginning of the day. - N.T.R.
6. Own movements, changes and conduct during the day - Pursuant to verbal orders of the Brigade Commander, telephonically communicated this regiment relieved a battalion of the 313th on the right of the sector and now occupies the entire brigade section with two companies in front line and two companies in support, and Second and Third Battalion in reserve. The line is thinly held all troops being placed wherever possible to obtain shelter. Relief of the right sector completed at 14h and the left at 14.45.
7. Information of neighboring units - The 313th Infantry, upon being relieved by us from the right of this brigade sector moved over and occupied the sector of the 158th Brigade.
8. Orders received. Telephone order from the 157th Brigade Hdqs. relative to relief of the 158th Brigade Infantry.
9. Action during the day and orders received and issued - Action - N.T.R. Necessary orders for the relief of the 313th Infantry.
10. Results of action both own and enemy - N.T.R.
11. Maps illustrating the above - N.T.R.
12. Estimate of the situation - unchanged
13. Plans for the future - Completely cloth and outfit the organization. To facilitate feeding & Supplies - good.
