

OPERATIONS REPORT  
12 h to 8h 15 Nov. 1918.

1. Hostile situation at the beginning of the day - unchanged.
2. Information received of the enemy during the day - Officials of the Luck of Luxembourg appeared at our lines and were conducted through to Brigade B.C. by Regimental Adjutant. From conversation we gained that the Germans were withdrawing from our sector. They could give no verifications of the explosions at 815 8h29 and 8h31 - whether they were mines or ammunition dumps.

3. Hostile movements changes and action during the day - N.T.R.

4. Map illustrating the above - N.T.R.

5. Own situation at the beginning of the day - unchanged

6. Own movements, changes and conduct during the day - The 3rd Bn. took over the left Brigade sector relieving the 31st Infantry with two companies on the line and two companies in support. The right of the right Brigade sector was withdrawn to VILLE DE SAINT CHAMOND.

7. Information of neighboring units - Information gained by the Battalion commander left sector omits on the left.

8. Orders received - Telephonic orders from Hdqrs. 157th Brigade relative to changes in disposition of troops.

9. Action during the day and orders received and issued - Relief of the 31st Infantry by our Third Battalion completed at 19h45.

10. Results of action both own and enemy - N.T.R.

11. Maps illustrating the above N.T.R.

12. Estimate of the situation - unchanged.

13. Plans for the future, dependent on orders.

14. Morale - good. Supplies - good.
