1. Hostile situation throughout the day - unchanged.
2. Improvisation occurred at the enemy during the day - Officers of the British Royal Artillery appealed to our lines and were conducted through to British Headquarters by Regimental Adjutant. From conversation we learned that the Germans were withdrawing from our sector. They concluded no reinforcements of the explosives at 815 hrs and 815 -- whether they were mines or ammunition dumps.
3. Hostile movements changes and sector during the day - N.T.R.

5. Own situation at the beginning of the day - unchanged.
6. Own movements, changes and conduct during the day - The 3rd Bn. took over the Left Brigade sector relieving the 313th Infantry with two companies on the line and two companies in support. The right of the battalion commander left sector units - Information gained by the information of neighboring units - Information gained by the battalion commander left sector units on the left.
7. Orders received - Telephone orders from Hdqrs. 157th Brigade relative to changes in disposition of troops.
